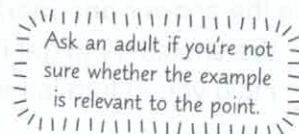

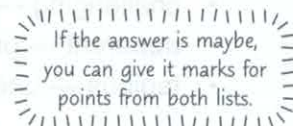


Point	Evidence

Calm	Callum released the rabbit 'without saying anything'.
Rational or sensible	He realised the 'terrible creature' was just a rabbit before his dad did.
